

## **CT Contrast Instructions**

This exam will take approximately 30 minutes. This includes paperwork, establishing intravenous access for contrast, and the scan time. Computed tomography (CT or CAT scan) is a diagnostic imaging procedure that uses a combination of X-rays and computer technology to produce horizontal, or axial images (often called slices) of the body. A CT scan shows detailed images of any part of the body, including the bones, muscles, fat, and organs.

- 1. No food 4 hours before exam and clear liquids only.
- 2. Please drink plenty of water prior to your exam
- 3. If receiving contrast, hold Metformin 48 hrs following scan
- 4. If receiving contrast and you have a known allergy to iodine, please bring it to the staff's immediate attention.
- 5. If you are claustrophobic, please bring it to the staff's immediate attention.
- 6. If you are, or think you could be pregnant, please bring it to the staff's immediate attention.
- 7. If you are nursing and receiving IV contrast, discontinue breast-feeding for 24 hours after your procedure.
